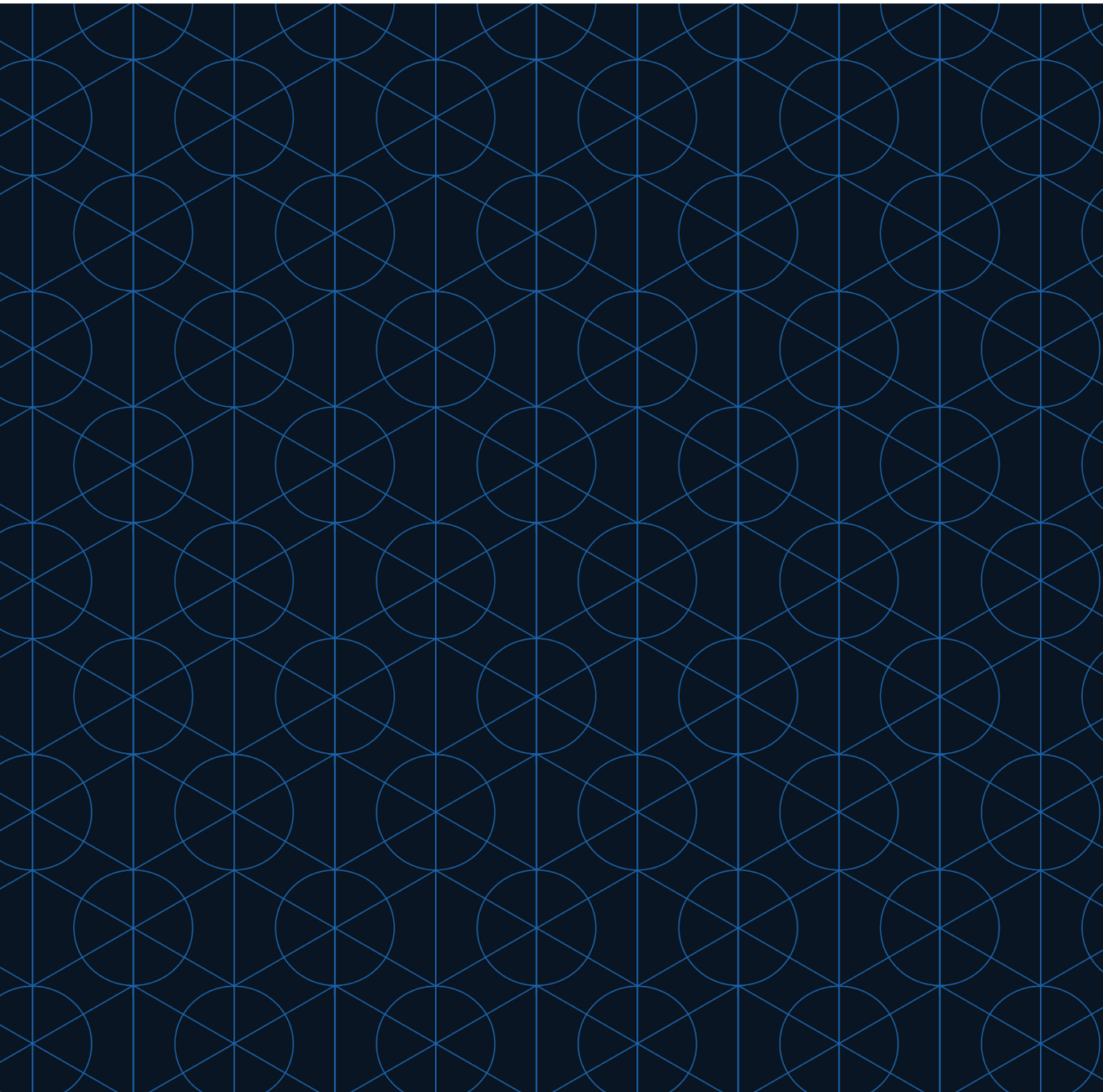

## 2. Application

This policy applies to all employees, contractors, and vendors while doing business with The Company and others who have access to European Union (EU) and the European Economic Area (EEA) data subject information ("personal data") in connection with the Company's operating activities.

## 3. Policy

PTM EDV Systeme GmbH believes in transparency about collection and use of data. This policy provides information about how and when PTM EDV Systeme GmbH uses cookies for these purposes. Capitalized terms used in this policy but not defined have the meaning set forth in our Privacy Policy, which also includes additional details about the collection and use of information at PTM EDV Systeme GmbH. For the purposes of this document, PTM EDV Systeme GmbH will be referred to as "Company" in all subsequent mentions. This terminology is utilized for simplicity and ease of reading. Please interpret all mentions of "Company" as direct references to PTM EDV Systeme GmbH.

## 4. What is a cookie?

Cookies are small text files sent by us to your computer or mobile device, which enable the Company features and functionality. They are unique to your account or your browser. Session-based cookies last only while your browser is open and are automatically deleted when you close your browser. Persistent

cookies last until you or your browser delete them or until they expire.

## 5. Does The Company use cookies?

Yes, the Company uses cookies and similar technologies like single-pixel gifs and web beacons. The Company uses both session-based and persistent cookies. The Company sets and accesses cookies on the domains operated by the Company and its corporate affiliates (collectively, the "Sites"). In addition, the Company uses third party cookies, like Google Analytics.

## 6. How is the Company using cookies?

Some cookies are associated with your account and personal information to remember that you are logged in and which workspaces you are logged into. Other cookies are not tied to your account but are unique and allow us to carry out analytics and customization, among other similar things.

Cookies can be used to recognize you when you visit a Site or use our Services, remember your preferences, and give you a personalized experience that is consistent with your settings. Cookies also make your interactions faster and more secure. You can always find up-to-date and detailed information on all cookies via our Cookie Management tool (see point 12).

## 7. How do the cookie settings work?

You can set your browser so that you are informed about the setting of cookies and only allow cookies in individual cases, exclude the acceptance of cookies for certain cases or in general and activate the automatic deletion of cookies when closing the browser. You can regularly obtain the procedure for deactivating cookies via the "Help" function of your Internet browser. When disabling cookies, the functionality and/or full availability of this website may be limited.

### Categories of use:

- **Authentication:** If you're signed into the Services, cookies help the Company show you the right information and personalize your experience.
- **Security:** The Company uses cookies to enable and support security features, and to help detect malicious activity.
- **Preferences, features, and services:** Cookies denote which language you prefer and what your communications preferences are. They can help fill out forms on our Sites more easily. They also provide you with features, insights, and customized content.
- **Marketing:** The Company may use cookies to help deliver marketing campaigns and track their performance (e.g., a user visited the Company.com and then made a purchase). Similarly, the Company's partners may use cookies to provide us with information about your interactions with their services, but use of those third-party cookies would be subject to the service provider's policies.
- **Performance, Analytics, and Research:** Cookies help the Company learn how well the Sites and Services perform. The Company also uses cookies to understand, improve, and research products,

features, and services, including to create logs and record when you access our Sites and Services from different devices, such as your work computer or your mobile device.

## 8. What third-party cookies does The Company use?

You can find a list of the third-party cookies that the Company uses on our sites along with other relevant information via our Cookie Manager (see point 12). The Company does its best to keep this table updated, but please note that the number and names of cookies, pixels, and other technologies may change from time to time.

## 9. How are cookies used for advertising purposes?

Cookies and other ad technology such as beacons, pixels, and tags help the Company market more effectively to users that may be interested in the Services. They also help with aggregated auditing, research, and reporting.

## 10. On what legal basis do we use cookies?

Technically necessary cookies are used on the basis of Article 6(1)(f) GDPR (legitimate interest in providing a functional, secure website) or, where applicable, Article 6(1)(b) GDPR (performance of a contract, e.g., maintaining a shopping cart or login session). These cookies are essential for the operation of our website and cannot be disabled through our consent tool.

All other cookies (e.g., for analytics, marketing, or personalization) are only set with your prior consent in accordance with Article 6(1)(a) GDPR. You may withdraw or change your consent at any time via the Cookie Manager available in the footer of our website. Please note that blocking certain categories of cookies may impact your experience and the functionality of the website.

## 11. Does the Company respond to Do Not Track Signals?

The Sites and Services do not collect personal information about your online activities over time and across third-party websites or online services. Therefore, “do not track” signals transmitted from web browsers do not apply to the Sites or Services, and the Company does not alter any data collection and use practices upon receipt of such a signal.

## 12. Where can I find detailed cookie information?

Detailed information on all cookies used on our website, including vendor, description, link to the vendor’s privacy policy, data collected, purpose of collection, legal basis, retention period, and place of processing, is available at any time via our Cookie Manager.

You can access detailed information by clicking on **“Settings”** on the Cookie Consent Banner. The Cookie

Manager then lists all categories of cookies (e.g., Technically necessary, Measurement, Advertisements, Personalization, Social Media, Other). By clicking on the **“?” (information)** icon next to each category, you can view all cookies in that category together with their details in a structured format.
